

1 Schedule 1 of the Liquor Control and Licensing Regulation, B.C. Reg. 244/2002, is amended

(a) under the heading “Licence Application Fees” by striking out everything after

Brewer	550
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and substituting the following:

Winery	
– with no endorsement	550
– with special event endorsement	660
– with winery lounge endorsement	880
– both winery lounge or special event endorsements	990
U-Brew and U-Vin	550

(b) under the heading “Annual Licence Fees” by striking out the following:

Liquor primary, liquor primary club and food primary, for second and subsequent years of licensing, if the amount spent by the licensee on liquor purchases in the prior calendar year is

– \$12 500 or less	275
– over \$12 500 and up to \$20 000	550
– over \$20 000 and up to \$45 000	825
– over \$45 000 and up to \$100 000	1 100
– over \$100 000 and up to \$250 000	1 300
– over \$250 000	1 500
Distiller	1 100
Brewer	\$0.11 a hectolitre multiplied by the total number of hectolitres of malt liquor shipped by a Brewer in the Province, from any brewery owned, occupied or used by that brewer in the previous year ending on December 31, with a minimum fee of 1 100
Winery, if producing more than 135 000 litres of wine a year	
– with both winery lounge and special event endorsements	1 475
– with winery lounge endorsement only	1 375
– with special event endorsement only	1 200
– neither winery lounge nor special event endorsement	1 100
Winery, if producing 135 000 litres of wine or less a year	
– with both winery lounge and special event endorsements	925

– with winery lounge endorsement only	825
– with special event endorsement only	650
– neither winery lounge nor special event endorsement	550

(c) by adding the heading “Renewal Fees” after

– with special event endorsement	1 210
– with winery lounge endorsement	1 430
– with both winery lounge and special event endorsements	1 540

Winery, if producing 135 000 litres of wine or less a year	
– with no endorsements	550
– with special event endorsement	660
– with winery lounge endorsement	880
– with both winery lounge and special event endorsements	990

(e) under the heading “Late Renewals” by striking out “125” and substituting “200”, and

(f) by striking out everything under the heading “Applications For Amendments To Licences” and substituting the following:
