THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION BOARD OF BRITISH COLUMBIA RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

RE: Recognition of Bursitis, Tendinitis and Tenosynovitis as Occupational Diseases

WHEREAS:

Pursuant to section 82 of the *Workers Compensation Act*, RSBC 1996, Chapter 492 and amendments thereto ("*Act*"), the Board of Directors must set and revise as necessary the policies of the Board of Directors, including policies respecting compensation, assessment, rehabilitation, and occupational health and safety;

AND WHEREAS:

The Board has authority under section 1 and section 225 of the *Act* to designate or recognize a disease as an occupational disease without specifying that it is peculiar to or characteristic of a particular process, trade or occupation, by including that occupational disease in the *Occupational Disease Recognition Regulation*, B.C. Reg. 71/99 ("*ODR Regulation*");

AND WHEREAS:

Schedule B of the *Act* was amended in 2000 to list specific forms of bursitis, tendinitis and tenosynovitis rather than listing these diseases generally.

AND WHEREAS:

Pursuant to the Provincial Government's Regulatory Reform Policy, the Board of Directors has evaluated the proposed regulatory amendments according to the established regulatory criteria.

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS RESOLVES THAT:

- To confirm that the Board recognizes bursitis, tendinitis and tenosynovitis as occupational diseases without specifying that they are peculiar to or
 - characteristic of a particular process, trade or occupation, the changes to the *ODR Regulation*, as per the attached Appendix "A", and consequential amendments to *Rehabilitation Services & Claims Manual*, Vol. II, policy item #26.03, *Recognition by Regulation of General Application*, as per the attached Appendix "B", are approved.
- 2. The Regulatory Criteria Exemption Form attached as Appendix "C" is approved.
- 3. The above amendments to the *ODR Regulation* will be deposited with the Registrar of Regulations in such form as may be required by the Registrar.
- 4. The above amendments to the *ODR Regulation* come into force 90 days after their deposit under the *Regulations Act*.
- The above amendments to policy are effective on the date that the above noted regulatory amendments come into force and apply to all initial decisions on or after that date.
- This resolution constitutes a policy decision of the Board of Directors.

APPENDIX A

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS RESOLVES THAT:

1 Section 1 of the Occupational Disease Recognition Regulation, B.C. Reg. 71/99, is amended by adding the following diseases:

Bursitis (other than the forms of bursitis mentioned in Item 12 of Schedule B of the Act);

Tendinitis, Tenosynovitis (other than the forms of tendinitis and tenosynovitis mentioned in item 13 of Schedule B of the Act).

This amendment comes into force 90 days after its deposit under the Regulations Act.
