SCHEDULE

- 1 Section 25 of the Wines of Marked Quality Regulation, B.C. Reg. 168/2018, is amended
 - (a) by adding the following paragraph:
 - (a.1) no more than 5% of the total wine by volume is derived from non-labrusca grape varieties as set out in table 2 of Schedule 1; , *and*
 - (b) in paragraph (d) by striking out "column 3 of Schedule 1" and substituting "column 3 of table 1 in Schedule 1".
- 2 Section 45 is amended by adding "of the total wine by volume" after "90%".
- 3 Section 49 (3) is amended by adding the following paragraph:
 - (f) a glass cork or glass stopper.
- 4 Section 51 (3) is amended by repealing paragraphs (b) and (c) and substituting the following:
 - (b) a dual-varietal name may be stated if,
 - (i) of the total wine by volume, at least 90% is derived from a combination of the 2 named grape varieties, and
 - (ii) of the total wine by volume, at least 13.5% is derived from the second of those varieties;
 - (c) a triple-varietal name may be stated if,
 - (i) of the total wine by volume, at least 95% is derived from a combination of the 3 named grape varieties,
 - (ii) of the total wine by volume, at least 14.25% is derived from the second of those varieties, and
 - (iii) of the total wine by volume, at least 9.5% is derived from the third of those varieties.
- 5 Section 57 (b) is amended by striking out "95%" and substituting "85%".
- 6 Schedule 1 is amended
 - (a) by adding the following heading before the table:
