Pharmacy Operations General Regulation

- 4** *Section 2 of the Pharmacy Operations General Regulation, B.C. Reg. 43/2018, is repealed and the following substituted:*

Health care professions prescribed as practitioners

- 2** The classes of persons who are prescribed for the purposes of paragraph (c) (i) of the definition of “practitioner” in section 1 of the Act are persons who are authorized under the *Health Professions and Occupations Act* to practise any of the following designated health professions:
- (a) pharmacy;
 - (b) nursing, psychiatric nursing or midwifery;
 - (c) optometry;
 - (d) naturopathic medicine.
